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

### How to Measure Your Space


A rough drawing of your space is useful and will help us with the design process. See below for a sample floor plan. Once you have dimensions and a basic sketch of your space, transfer the information to the grid on the next page of this guide. Here are some helpful hints to get you started.

#### **Tips for Measuring Your Space**

- Use a pencil to facilitate easy changes
- Measure in inches only
- Be sure to note all fixtures and utilities (with dimensions)
- Also note all electrical outlets/switches (with dimensions)
- Include location and size of windows and doors
- Note the size and location of existing appliances
- · Indicate which way doors swing and into what rooms
- · Breaks in walls and obstructions should also be noted
- Denote ceiling height and indicate any transitions, soffits and/or vents



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#### How to Measure Windows and Doors


Measure each door and window and record in the grid below. Measurements should be from the outside edges of the window/door – trim to trim. All dimensions should be in inches.
